SITUATION

1. Biathlon is offered through a progressive system of competitions. Every Regional Cadet Support Unit will host zone and regional competitions with the aim of identifying the most competitive cadet biathletes to advance to the National Cadet Biathlon Championship. The zone biathlon competitions for Pacific Region have now concluded, and selected cadets will be able to proceed to the Provincial Biathlon Championships. The top ten cadets will advance to the National Biathlon Championship.

MISSION

2. The Regional Cadet Support Unit (Pacific) will organize the provincial biathlon competition for cadets to take place as per dates below:

EXECUTION

4. The Biathlon Provincial Competition will be conducted as follows:

- a. <u>General Outline</u>: As per the assigned dates, these activities will be conducted in three phases:
 - (1) Phase 1 Initial Preparation:
 - (a) determination of logistical requirements;
 - (b) booking of rations, quarters, equipment, and transportation;
 - (c) identification of personnel attending;
 - (d) preparation of requisite pay and travel documentation; and
 - (e) set-up of biathlon competition course.
 - (2) Phase 2 Conduct of the activity:
 - (a) arrival of cadet participants and staff; and
 - (b) conduct of the biathlon competition.
 - (3) Phase 3 –Post-Activity Admin:
 - (a) departure of cadets and staff;
 - (b) post-administration and distribution of results; and
 - (c) process pay and claims.
- b. <u>Groupings and Tasks</u>: As per Annex A
- c. <u>Co-ordinating Instructions</u>: Co-ordinating instructions are as follows:
 - (1) <u>Registration of Participants</u>. A list of cadets who have qualified to proceed to the Provincial Biathlon Championship is attached at Annex B. These cadets have been entered into FORTRESS under Serial BiathProv20, and have been confirmed by the J3 Trg O (RDA-ND). In addition, the list will be posted on SharePoint for maximum distribution.
 - (2) <u>Support Cadets</u>. Support cadets must be identified to the Competition Coordinator NLT 5 Feb 20. In addition to cadet officials, support cadets can also be cadet coaches. This is not a mandatory role but is meant as an opportunity for leadership for senior cadets. These cadets must also have completed rifle handling and safety training and have some experience with biathlon. Their main functions will be range assistants or a team manager. Teams will be allowed a maximum of one cadet coach.
 - (3) <u>Cadet Selection/Team Composition.</u> Annex C contains the Biathlon Competition General Instructions, and should be referenced for detailed information on team composition preparation, equipment, and competition rules. The Canadian Cadet Organizations Biathlon Championship Series uses the rules and basic competition structure as dictated by Biathlon Canada with provisions made for cadet team structure.

- (4) <u>Coaches Briefing</u>: A briefing of all coaches and key competition staff will take place a minimum of one hour prior to the start of the biathlon competition to clarify rules, team composition and competition details.
- d. <u>Timings</u>. Annex D contains the Stage 3 Provincial Biathlon Competition Instructions, which will also be handed out at the time of the coaches briefing 15 Feb 20.
- e. <u>Finance</u>. Costs are to be assigned to the following Financial Coding and a Pre-Commitment will be issued separately. Fin Coding to be used: 54700A C120, applicable GL, IO: 216038.

SERVICE SUPPORT

- 4 Service Support elements are identified as follows:
 - a. <u>Rations</u>. All participants taking part in the Provincial Biathlon Competitions will be provided with all meals while competing. Cadets who need to travel long distances will be provided all meals while on route. The Regional J4 Movements officers will coordinate meals-on-route, as required.
 - b. <u>Accommodations</u>. Accommodations will be provided to competitors, coaches and staff who are required to stay overnight. Accommodations have been arranged at CTC Vernon.
 - c. Transportation. Transport details are as follows:
 - (1) All cadets who reside within the geographical area for Vernon must be dropped off at Vernon by a guardian;
 - (2) Staff members and coaches who reside within the geographical area for Vernon are considered local, and must make their own way to Vernon at the appropriate time; and
 - (3) For competitors, coach and staff who must travel from outside the local area, J3 Tgr O (RDA-ND) in conjunction with the J4 Movements Section at the RCSU (Pac) will coordinate travel to and from the competition venue.
 - d. <u>Medical</u>. Competition staff with current Standard First Aid will be assigned as duty First Aid Officers as a secondary task. They will be on call and remain in close proximity to the competition venue. These personnel will assess if an escalated level of care is required and if necessary drive and escort the cadet to an appropriate facility. Any urgent serious cases are to be addressed through 911.

- e. <u>Biathlon Equipment and Rentals</u>. Sovereign Lake Nordic Centre (SLNC) is the host club and provide all the range equipment and course equipment necessary for the competition. The Chief of Course, with the help of the J3 Trg O (RDA-ND), will be responsible for gathering all other necessary biathlon equipment and supplies. For those competitors who do not have their own equipment (ski's, poles and boots), these will be provided to the cadet competitors via rentals at the SLNC. RCSU (Pac) will cover the costs of all rentals.
- f. <u>Awards.</u> The top three competitors in each division (Junior, Senior and Youth) will receive recognition by the means of a placement medal (bronze, silver, gold). The details of how cadets will advance to the National Competition, can be found at Annex C.
- g. <u>Ammunition.</u> Ammunition for this competition will be supplied by RCSU (Pac). All pertinent paperwork will be completed within the week following the competition by the Competition Coordinator.

BIATHLON COMPETITION – GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

Competition Structure

- 1. The competition structure for cadets participating in biathlon is as follows:
 - a. Cadet Training/Selection (Stage I): Initial biathlon team training is to take place at the corps/squadron level. To gauge readiness for competition, cadets must be able to ski a minimum of 5 km in 1 to 2 km intervals. They must also be able to independently operate the Anschutz .22 biathlon rifle and safely carry out 2 bouts of shooting 5 targets at a distance of 50 m. Corps/Squadron Commanding Officers are to ensure rifle handling tests for the .22 single fire Anschutz have been completed prior to any training by a current Small Bore RSO or RSO (Biathlon). Accompanying team coaches must be prepared to certify that these rifle handling tests have been completed on all cadets on their team at time of registration for the competition. Cadets and coaches must also make themselves familiar with the basic rules, sequence and physical demands of a biathlon race.
 - b. Zone Competitions (Stage II): Pacific Region is divided into eight competition zones. Due to the limited competition venues, some zones will share a competition date and venue. In this case, each zone will still have separate results, awards, and billets for progression. Zone Biathlon Competitions will consist of one race IAW the Cadet Biathlon Rules for the Individual Race format. In an Individual Race, competitors will ski 3 loops, shoot 2 bouts, and start in timed intervals. There will be a coaches meeting prior to the race but it is in the best interest of all participants to review the CCM Biathlon Rule Book during pre-season preparations.
 - c. <u>Provincial Competition (Stage III)</u>: Cadets from every competition zone will be selected to compete at the Provincial Biathlon Competition based on their combined team score and their proximity to the top of their respective competitor category. The Provincial Biathlon Competition will consist of two races held over two days and will be fully supported by RCSU (Pac). The first race will be a sprint race. The second race will be a relay race. Both races will follow the rules laid out in the CCM Biathlon Rule book. Any cadet who wishes to qualify for the National Biathlon Championship must do so at the Provincial Competition without exception.
 - d. National Championship (Stage IV): Ten cadets and two coaches from the Provincial Biathlon Competition will be selected to compete at the National Biathlon Championship. The National Biathlon Championship consists of four races. Individual, team and provincial team standings are determined by combined points earned in each race. Cadets will be selected in their two person teams to attend. The National Biathlon Championship is fully supported by the NCJCR Sp Gp HQ.

Competitor Categories

- 2. Cadet competitor categories are based on the age of cadets participating and are defined as follows:
 - a. Junior: age 12-14;b. Senior: age 15-16; and
 - c. Youth: age 17-18.

Important Note: Age is based on the age of the cadet as of two days after the conclusion of the National Biathlon Championships (10 Mar 20). This is to ensure cadets compete in the same age category throughout the competition series.

General Competition Rules

- 3. Ten competitors (five teams of 2 cadets) will be selected from each zone to advance to compete at Stage III Provincial Biathlon Competition. In the event that a zone cannot fill its billets, the billets will be filled as wild card billets and competitive teams from other zones may also be selected.
- 8. Cadet team supervisory staff are encouraged to help provide extra supervision to the cadets while involved in the competition, but are not permitted to assist the cadets while they are involved in a race.
